DRESS/ATTIRE

Please assist your child to pick out clothing that is appropriate for the various activities outlined on the calendar. The kids will be walking. Please label your child's clothing and personal items. All children should wear tennis shoes/socks for all off-campus ventures to prevent blisters and sore feet. It is the parent's responsibility to ensure their child is properly equipped for a safe and successful summer experience. All children will be expected to participate in daily activities Sand Box has planned and provided.

****If your child cannot participate in these daily activities due to sore feet or blisters they will need to stay home or you will be responsible for finding alternate care.****

FIELDTRIPS

All field trips are listed on a calendar that will be sent home monthly in your parent mailbox. A monthly planner will be posted for your convenience. Check the center calendar weekly for updates or cancellations.

To assure the safety of all the children, it is our policy that children may NOT join a field trip already in progress.

For this reason, it is very important that parents take note of the departure time of each field trip and plan accordingly. If a child "misses the bus", the parent will be responsible for finding alternative care for their child; however, to avoid your child's disappointment – plan ahead.





CHAPERONES: If you are interested in chaperoning an event with your child, please contact Kelly Jensen prior to the fieldtrip for details and planning arrangements.
